Jesus, come to our hearts like falling rain:

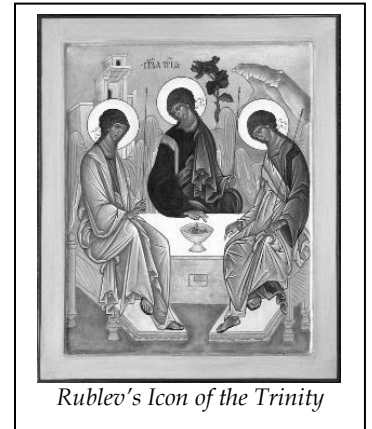
come to refresh, come to renew,
