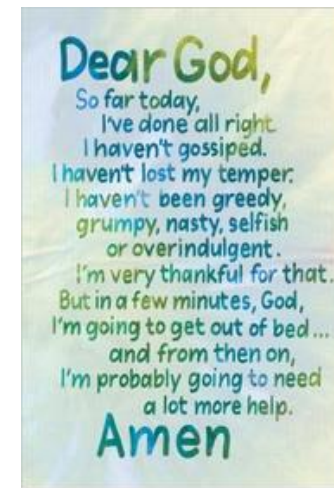

In his Easter Day sermon, Damon spoke of the tradition of observing "days of joy and laughter" following the church's celebration of Jesus' resurrection. The Joyful Newsletter website says - "The custom was rooted in the musings of early church theologians (like Augustine, Gregory of Nyssa, and John Chrysostom) that God played a practical joke on the devil by raising Jesus from the dead. "*Risus paschalis* - the Easter laugh," the early theologians called it."

This wonderful resource has been put together by Rev. Sarah Park, Auckland Diocesan Ministry Educator.

As she writes "I have long thought that as a Church we do a great job of observing Lent, often to the detriment of Easter... Easter felt like it was about survival, not resurrection life. A liturgical focus which dwells on human weakness during Lent without also dwelling on God's goodness in the resurrection life of Easter has serious implications for spirituality."
