Rabbi Sharon Brous describes a Rabbinic tradition which we invite you to do. Carry two pieces of paper around in your pockets or handbag today.

The first one reads: **"I am but dust and ashes"** That is to say: *It's not all about me. I can't control this, I can't do this on my own.*

The second piece of paper reads: **"For my sake the world was created"** Which means, *it's true I can't do everything but I can do some things. I can forgive, I can love, I can show up, I can protest, I can be part of this conversation.*
