Community House Update

After years of discussion and planning, work on the Community House building looks likely to begin in August or early spring. A grant of \$500,000 was recently approved by the Lotteries Commission; this is in addition to grants from Central Lakes Trust, Otago Community Trust, Sargood Trust, Alexander McMillan Trust, as well as other donations and fundraising initiatives. The Trust is in discussions with a contractor and a date at the end of July has been penciled in for the blessing of the land; further information to come.

Our Local Committee has appointed a sub-committee (Brian Collins, Helen Davis, Peter Hook, Rev. Damon Plimmer, and George Ritchie) to liaise with contractors and trustees during the build process.
