Community House Update

After years of discussion and planning, work on the Community House will soon begin. Major grants have been approved by Central Lakes Trust, Otago Community Trust, Lotteries Commission, Sargood Trust, and the Alexander McMillan Trust. Fundraising efforts are ongoing. Back in 2010 close to \$100,000 was pledged by St Columba's parishioners. If you are in a position to keep your pledge, or if you would like to make a contribution toward this project, please contact Rev. Damon Plimmer or Peter Hook.

The Trust is in discussions with the successful tenderer and a short service to bless the land will be held on Sunday 29 July. Further details to come.

Finally, the trees on the site, including the silver birches along McDougall St, will be brought down over the holidays, pro bono by Skip Johnson.
