William Tyndale, Translator of the Holy Scriptures, Martyr, 1536

Tyndale was born in Gloucestershire about 1494. As a student, he discovered the New Testament in the original Greek, and the translation of the Bible into contemporary English became his life's passion. Church opposition at home led him to settle on the continent. From there thousands of copies of the New Testament and some Old Testament books were secretly circulated in England. At last his enemies had him arrested, and he was strangled and burned at the stake in 1536. His last words were, "Lord, open the king of England's eyes."
