St Simon and St Jude, Apostles, 28 October

Simon and Jude were both members of the Twelve. Simon is described as a Zealot, but it is not clear whether that is a reference to his membership of what later became a nationalistic faction before he was converted, or a reference to his zeal for the Law, or even for the kingdom of God. Jude is traditionally regarded as the author of the letter of Jude, but this identification is uncertain. According to tradition, Simon and Jude were martyred together in Persia.
