**Richard Hooker, Priest, Theologian, 4 November**

Richard Hooker was born in Exeter in 1554. After studies at Oxford and ordination he became master of the Temple in 1585. He entered into debate with the Puritans, who were demanding further reforms of the Church of England. In his *Of the Laws of Ecclesiastical Polity*, Hooker offered a reasoned defence of the forms and practice of the Church of England, based on ideas of natural law given by God in creation. Hooker died as parish priest of Bishopsbourne near Canterbury in 1600.
