my peace and joy and love

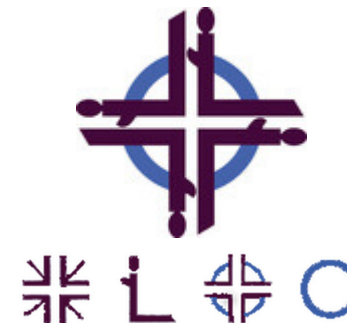
